The Collect:

Pour into our hearts, O Lord, the abundance of your heavenly grace; that, as the childbearing of the Blessed Virgin Mary was to us your servants the beginning of salvation, so the devout observance of her maternity may avail for the increase of our peace; through Jesus Christ your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, God, for all ages of ages. *Amen*

The First Reading: Numbers 6:22-27

Brethren: The LORD spoke to Moses, saying: Speak to Aaron and his sons, saying, Thus you shall bless the Israelites: You shall say to them, The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make his face to shine upon you, and be gracious to you; the LORD lift up his countenance upon you, and give you peace. So they shall put my name on the Israelites, and I will bless them.

The Gradual



Bless<u>ed</u> and venerable are you O <u>Virgin</u> Mary; * for without losing your virginity you became the Mo<u>ther</u> of God.

he whom the whole world cannot contain, <u>being</u> made man, * shut himself up with<u>in</u> your womb.

The Epistle: Galasians 4:4-7

Brethren: But when the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, in order to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as children. And because you are children, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, "Abba! Father!" So you are no longer a slave but a child, and if a child then also an heir, through God.

The Tract In votive masses after Septuagesima omit the Alleluia and its verses and say:

Rejoice O Virgin <u>Ma</u>ry * for alone have you destroyed <u>all</u> heresies. You believed the words of the Angel Gabriel.↓

The GospelLuke 2:16-21

At that time... So the shepherds went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them. After eight days had passed, it was time to circumcise the child; and he was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before he was conceived in the womb.
